| Types of cases the forms CAN be used for: | Any civil or criminal case where you have filed a Notice of Appeal. |
| Types of cases the forms CANNOT be used for: | Cases that are not filed in the appellate court. |
| Cost to File the forms: | None. |
| Special information or papers needed to complete the forms: | You will need: copies of the <i>Motion</i> and <i>Order</i> for each of the other parties or lawyers; the names and addresses of the other parties or lawyers; the name and address of the court where the document is being filed; and the appellate court case number. Businesses other than sole proprietorships cannot represent themselves in the appellate court. Please talk to a lawyer. |
