

8. Motions

Motion titles shall reflect the precise nature of the relief sought, such as "Motion for Extension of Time to File Appellant's Brief" rather than merely "Motion" or "Motion for Extension of Time." Motions shall state the relief sought and the support for the motion. When the motion is based on facts that do not appear of record, the motion shall be supported by affidavit. If counsel has conferred with opposing counsel and opposing counsel has no objection to the motion, that fact shall be stated in the motion title, body, and affidavit to allow the Appellate Court to rule on the motion. The procedures for motions are specified in Illinois Supreme Court Rules 361 and 610.
